New Business

- A. Discussion/Action: (Jerome Bivins) Consideration authorizing DPS to have Unit #322 (Jet Rodder) repaired by Jack Doheny Supplies for \$20,897.92, plus a 15% contingency (\$3,134.69) for a total of \$24,032.61. Budgeted funds are from account #592-564-395-000 (Equipment repair)

Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hendricks, Seconded by Councilmember Williams to approve DPS request to have a Jet Rodder repaired.

- B. Discussion/Action: (Mark Stuhldreher) Consideration of an Intergovernmental Fire/Police Dispatch Service Agreement between Westland, Inkster, Wayne and Garden City, Michigan.

Moved by Councilmember Williams, Seconded by Councilmember Shaw to approve an intergovernmental contract for emergency 911 dispatch services.

Public Participation

- **Dorothy Gardner**- Asked is the City participating in any partnerships with other organizations and if an Emergency Financial Manager could modify mileages passed by citizen vote.
- **Michael Tomasovich**-Commented on the cities modified brush collection contracted with Republic waste.
- **Regina Lewis**-Asked if yard waste can be burned by citizens and commented on the budget.

Mayor and Council Communications

- **Councilman Williams**- Asked administration to see if Citizen Groups can write violations for long grass.

Moved by Councilmember Williams, Seconded by Councilmember Howard to suspend the hiring of additional personnel in the Clerk's office until an accounting of the charge backs are received. – Motion was later withdrawn.

- **Councilman Hendricks**-Commented on compost and brush pick up.He asked that the administration look into reinstating compost pick up back into the budget.
- **Councilman Shaw**-Asked about charging owners of multiple rental properties for business licenses. He would like additional information on a water amnesty program. In addition, he is concerned about motorcycles racing down Avondale.
- **Mayor Hampton**-Discussed traffic enforcement citations by camera. In addition, Mayor Hampton said he will be meeting with Senator Kahn of the State Ways and Means Committee to request financial support for the Reinvent Inkster initiative and a Public Safety Grant.

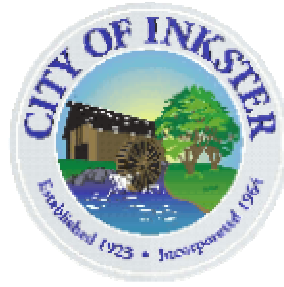
